Football legend Bert Williams shares RAF wartime memories

Thursday 30th June 2011 11.30am

Ex England and Wolverhampton Wanderers goalkeeper, Bert Williams, will be visiting the Royal Air Force Museum Cosford to assist the Museum with their ongoing project which examines the lives of footballers who served in the armed forces, in particular the RAF, during the Second World War era. Bert, now aged 91 will be visiting the Museum on Thursday 30th June 2011 at 11.30am to meet with the Museums Education Officer who is leading the research project.

Bert began his football career in October 1937 playing for Walsall, but after only two seasons of professional football, the outbreak of World War II halted Bert's progress. He went on to become a Physical Training Instructor (PTI) in the Royal Air Force during the 1940's and for part of his RAF career was based at RAF Cosford. He spent six years in the Royal Air Force, but not wanting to give up on his love for football; Bert joined the RAF football team and often played in matches against other RAF teams and even the Army. On rare occasions he even made professional guest appearances at football matches for teams whilst stationed around the country, including Nottingham Forest and Chelsea.

At the end of World War II, Bert resumed his professional football career when he signed for Wolverhampton Wanderers in September 1945. He spent most of his playing career at the club where he won the League Championship and FA Cup. After lifting the FA Cup with Wolverhampton Wanderers in 1949, Bert was called to play for England later that year and remained the number one England goalkeeper throughout the 1950 FIFA World Cup. After 420 appearances with Wolverhampton Wanderers, Bert finally retired from professional football in May 1957.

Bert will meet with the Education Officer during his visit where he will be sharing some of his own knowledge and experiences of life as a professional footballer within the RAF, during the difficult period of World War II. Bert's experience will be recorded by the Museum and used as part of the research.

RAF Museum Cosford Education Officer, Philip Clayton says:

"During the Second World War, Bert Williams and his fellow RAF comrades were members of a remarkable football team. These stars of the day; Raich Carter (Sunderland), Stan Mortensen (Blackpool) and Stanley Mathews (Stoke), played with Bert in front of large audiences throughout the UK, as part of the RAF football team. It will be fascinating to hear Bert's memories of this time."

This project is believed to be one of the first of its kind and the more information that can be gathered, the better. If anyone has any memories, information, photos or medals of people who served in the forces and played for Wolves, we would like to hear from you.
